
What is Kentucky All STARS?


Kentucky All STARS is a rating system for early care and education programs that receive public funding; this includes child care centers, Head Start, in-home providers, and public preschools.


Kentucky All STARS has three main goals:


- 1. Enhance the quality of early care and education settings for all children throughout the state of Kentucky
- 2. Incorporate standards that will promote school readiness for all children through the addition of assessment and screening standards
- 3. Ensure that quality care will be available to all children, especially children at risk because of a variety of circumstances.

Programs who choose to participate at a Level 3 or higher have also had their program environment observed using the appropriate Environmental Rating Scale.









What are the All STARS Levels?

Kentucky All STARS is a 5 level hybrid rating system. The hybrid rating system incorporates both **required standards** for each level and **points**.

Each level builds on the level before.

Levels 1 and 2 have required standards that need to be met.

Levels 3-5 have a combination of required and optional standards.

Applications and a <u>Standards Quality Verification Checklist</u> must be completed for **Levels 2-5**. The following table lists the standards and shows what the standards are at each Quality Level.
